NAEB MEETING SET FOR MAY 4

IN CONNECTION WITH OHIO STATE'S THIRTEENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE ON EDUCATION BY RADIO, NAEB WILL HOLD ITS ANNUAL MEETING WEDNESDAY EVENING, MAY 4. MEETING IS SCHEDULED FOR 8 P.M., ROOM 1007, DESHLER-WALLICK HOTEL, COLUMBUS, OHIO.

WE'LL BE THERE; HOPE YOU'LL BE THERE. ENGEL, ANDREW MCCARTY, JENNINGS, KEN BARTLETT, WALDO ABBOT, HIGGY ARE AMONG THOSE WE'VE BEEN TOLD WHO WILL BE ON HAND. NO DOUBT THERE WILL BE MORE, AND THERE SHOULD BE.

FEELING THAT THE GENERAL PROBLEMS OF RADIO AND TV WILL BE ADEQUATELY COVERED BY THE INSTITUTE PROGRAM, PRESIDENT ENGEL IS GOING TO DIRECT THE NAEB MEETING TOWARD PROBLEMS SPECIFIC TO OUR OWN.

STORY ON D & C - OUT OF TITLES TO GRIFFITH

MARCH 1 ISSUE OF THE NEWS LETTER SHOULD HAVE CARRIED A STORY NOT, BUT WE NEGLECTED TO PUBLISH IT THEN. HERE IT IS WITH APOLOGIES TO W. F. GRIFFITH.

"EFFECTIVE FEBRUARY 1, 1948 WE DECIDED TO LIMIT OUR ACCESS TO THE HOME SERVICE RECORDS AND BOOKS. THIS WAS TO AVOID TO OMIT OUR FARM FACTS PROGRAM, EARLY MORNING REPORTS, RADIO SERVICES, AND A PART OF OUR NEWS HOUR PROGRAM." DUE TO A COURT ORDER WHILE NO REASON IS GIVEN IT BECOMES APPARENT THAT THIS ORDER IS ISSUED TO PROTECT THE RIGHTS OF D & C TO OBTAIN DAMAGE BY HOLDING A COPY FOR EMERGENCY RECORDS. ON THE FOURTH INSTANT COURT ORDER MAY ASK KENTON BEECHER TO IMMEDIATELY REMOVE ANY RECORDS OF ANY KIND OF NIGHT. WE ARE ATTEMPTING TO OBTAIN PERMISSION TO OBTAIN DURING THE HOUR OF 10 P.M. TO 11 P.M. HOURS ON WEEKENDS WHICH IN ORDER THAT WE COULD INTERVIEW AND INTERVIEW WITH THE FBI ON AGENCY OR OTHER.

ON THAT DATE, THE DEFENSE RECREATION CENTER BEGAN A RADIO SERIES, ENTITLED "90 PART SHOWCASE" TO BE HEARD EACH WEEK OVER NEW YORK CITY'S OWN STATION WNYC.

THE SHOW FEATURES INTERVIEWS WITH MEN FROM ALL BRANCHES OF THE ARMED SERVICES CONDUCTED BY THE FAMOUS NAMES OF THE THEATRE. IN ADDITION, THERE IS ENTERTAINMENT BY THE ENTERTAINMENT UNITS FROM THE MANY CAMPS IN THE NEW YORK AREA AND A TALK BY A "GUEST OF THE WEEK" ONE OF THE MANY MEN AND WOMEN ENGAGED IN HELPING THE MEN FEEL AT HOME IN THE BIGGEST CITY IN THE WORLD.

WNYE, BOARD OF EDUCATION, NEW YORK CITY, WAS GRANTED MODIFICATION OF CONSTRUCTION PERMIT, EXTENDING COMPLETION DATE. (4/3/42)

WBEZ, BOARD OF EDUCATION, CHICAGO, WAS GRANTED EXTENSION OF COMPLETION DATE ON ITS FM CONSTRUCTION PERMIT TO JULY 1, 1942. (4/3/42)

WNYC, CITY OF NEW YORK, HAD ORAL ARGUMENT BEFORE FCC ON PROPOSED FINDINGS FOR MODIFICATION OF LICENSE TO INCREASE HOURS OF OPERATION.
