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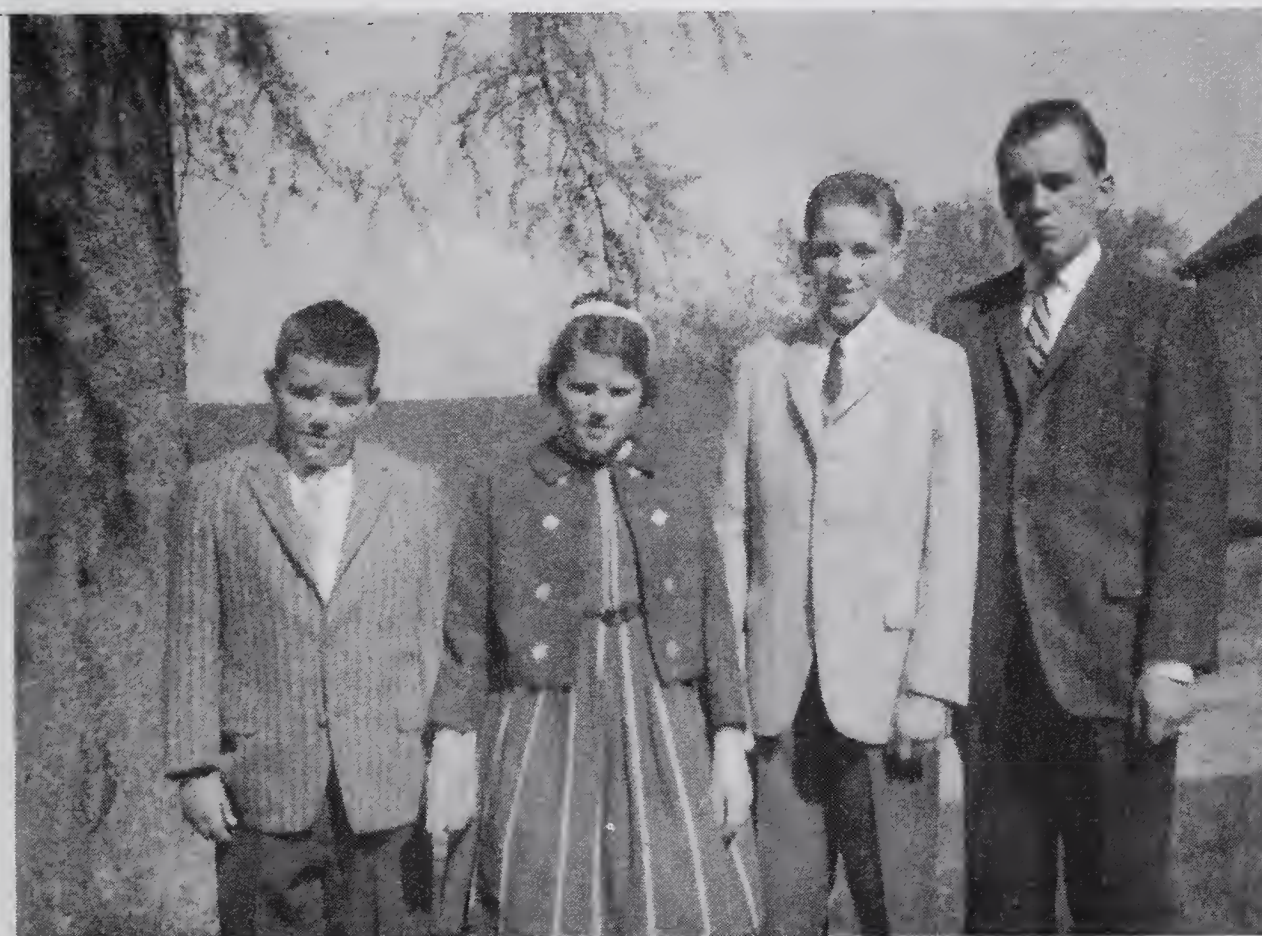

Arms: Argent, on a bend sable, three buckles d'or

Crest: A demi-lion azure, holding in the dexter paw a dagger proper

Motto: Quod non pro patria

This same coat-of-arms was borne by the Stirlings.

My mother, Florence Lillian Bowie, was a descendant in the sixth generation from George¹ Bowie, who came from Stirlingshire, Scotland, to Boston, Mass. and married there in 1743 Mary Smalley, of Truro, Mass.

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EXPLANATIONS

The different generations are indicated by raised numerals. For example, on page three "George ¹ Bowie" means the George Bowie who first came to this country from Scotland - in other words, the George of the first generation.

The children of George ¹ Bowie are listed with Roman numerals, and since they are all of the second generation, the name of the first one, Isabel, is given the raised numeral ² to indicate that all of her brothers and sisters are also of that generation. Her brothers, George and Alexander, in addition to their Roman numerals, are given cardinal numerals since they have male descendants by the name of Bowie, and their families are discussed in order of those cardinal numerals. For example, "1. iii. George" means that George ² is the third child of George ¹ and will be discussed first.

The names in parentheses after these Bowie names show the ancestors of each. For example, on page six "Alexander ³ (George ², George ¹)" means that Alexander of the third generation is the son of George of the second who, in turn, is the son of the pioneer George.

All places named are in the state of Maine unless otherwise stated, and all personal names are Bowie names unless other surnames are given. For example, on page nine "Arnold Stoddard⁴ (George³, George², George¹) was born 20 July, 1800 in Durham" means that Arnold Stoddard Bowie is in the fourth generation from the first George and was born 20 July, 1800, in Durham, Maine.

*Walter Worthington Bowie in The Bowies and Their Kindred, published in 1899, states that "among the children of John Bowie, Jr., of Denny, were James, Agnes, John, William, Robert, Christian, and Thomas." No mention is made of our George Bowie, but since George came to Boston, Mass., when he was a young man of about twenty-one years of age, and died eight years later, it is not surprising that his name is omitted from the list, which the author admits is not complete.

The fact that we know that our George Bowie was born at or near Stirling, Scotland; that he was believed to have been an uncle to a John Bowie in the South (Maj. John Bowie emigrated to Va., married in Tenn., and finally settled in S. Carolina); that he named one daughter Jane (His mother's name was Janet Bowie, if he belonged in this family, and Janet is a diminutive of Jane); that he named his other daughter Isabel (His grandmother's name would have been Isabel Bowie); and that his sons were George and Alexander, names which occur in the southern branch of the family, as you can see from the chart - - all these facts make it seem more than likely that our George Bowie was the son of John Bowie, Jr., of the Parish of Denny, Stirlingshire, Scotland.

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GEORGE BOWIE OF STIRLINGSHIRE, SCOTLAND, AND BOSTON AND TRURO, MASSACHUSETTS: HIS ANCESTRY AND DESCENDANTS

The earliest record which we have of George Bowie (Bowoeey or Boey, as his name was spelled in the Boston and Truro records) was that of his marriage in Boston on 26 July, 1743, to Mary Smalley, of Truro.* Since there is no other record in this country of George Bowie (Bowoeey, Boey, Boe, Bowey, Bowe, Bowa, Boah, Boye, etc.) until the record of the birth of his first child in Truro the following year, it may be that he had not lived in this country long.

Tradition in the Bowie family has it that George Bowie came to this country from Scotland as a stowaway on a ship load of lime and that he jumped from the ship when it entered Boston Harbor and swam to shore. Several older members of the family remember distinctly his small steel-bound leather trunk that was handed down in the family for many generations, in fact, until it was burned in 1942. They remember that in that trunk were letters from Stirlingshire, Scotland, the picture of a country home in Stirling, and other family pictures, also a coat-of-arms presented by Lord Tracy.

It has been conjectured that George Bowie was the son of a John Bowie, of Stirlingshire, Scotland, and the grandson of another John Bowie of that shire. Walter Worthington Bowie in The Bowie and Their Kindred traces the ancestry of the Maryland Bowies from John Bowie, Sr., of the Parish of Denny, near Stirling, Stirlingshire, and his son, John, also of Denny. Since the tradition among the Maine Bowies is that George Bowie was closely related to the southern Bowies, it may be that George was the son of John, Jr., who was born in 1685 and married at Denny Kirk, Parish of Denny, near Stirling, in Stirlingshire, on 29 July, 1715, Janet Young. John, Jr., is mentioned as clerk of the parish, a burgess, and later, a merchant. Thus the grandfather of George Bowie would have been John Bowie, Sr., who, born about 1665, married on 14 March, 1685, at Denny Kirk, Isabelle Ewing. John, Sr., owned land and was a burgess.

Boston Marriages, 1752 - 1809: "George Bowacy of Boston and Mary Smalley of Truro were married by the Rev. John Avery July 26, 1743, in Boston." (The "Bowacy" of the second record was evidently a careless clerk's mistake in reading "Bowoeey".)

If this is true, George Bowie was a brother to the James Bowie who, born about 1718, crossed over into Dumbartonshire, Scotland, and settled in New Kilpatrick, and there married on 11 June, 1739, Margaret Tyre. The eldest son of James and Margaret (Tyre) Bowie was Major John Bowie, who was born in New Kilpatrick 10 May, 1740. In 1762, Major John emigrated to Virginia, settling first in Tennessee, where he married in 1767 Rosa Reid, and later moved to South Carolina. The fact that three of Major John Bowie's sons bore the names of James, George, and Alexander - names which have been found many times among George Bowie's descendants - makes it all the more probable that George and Major John were closely related, probably uncle and nephew.*

E. S. Stackpole in his History of Durnam, Maine states that "George Bowie came from Scotland with a brother Alexander and married in Cape Elizabeth, Maine, Dec. 20, 1775 Rachel Strout." There is, however, no record in Boston of a brother Alexander for our first George Bowie, but there are records in Truro of the birth there to the first George and his wife, Mary Smalley, of two sons, George and Alexander, the first of whom married in Cape Elizabeth, Maine, 20 Dec., 1775, Rachel Strout.

There is no record of the death of the first George Bowie, but it must have been between 24 March and 14 May, 1749, for when George's fourth child, Alexander, was born in Truro 24 March, 1749, Alexander was said to be the "son of George and Mary Boey," but when he was baptized two months later, only the mother's name was given.

Mary (Smalley) Bowie was born in Truro in October, 1721, the daughter of Samuel and Issabel (Dyer) Smalley. (See Appendix A for an account of the Smalley, Hicks and Dyer Families.) Mary Bowoey was admitted to the Truro Church 12 August, 1744, the year following her marriage to George Bowoey.

On 17 September, 1753, the widow Boey ('Bacy', in the record) married in Truro James Ridley, son of Thomas and Mary (Strout) Ridley. (See Appendix B for an account of the Strout

* The eldest son of Major John Bowie was James Bowie, who was born in 1770 and died in 1781 from the effects of small pox. Another son was Judge George Bowie, who was born in 1772, and became a well-known jurist, in whose office the famous John C. Calhoun studied law. A third son was Alexander Bowie, who was born in 1789, and became the Chancellor of Alabama.

and Ridley families.) About four years later Mary (Smalley) Ridley went with her husband and children to Harpswell, Maine. According to an old deed dated 30 March, 1765, the Ridleys bought one hundred acres of upland and one acre of marshland, including Bass(now Ridley) Point on Sebascodegin (now Great) Island in the district of Harpswell. At that time James Ridley was called a laborer, but in a later deed, dated 1771, a miller. He was a daring woodsman and a bold hunter, spending much of his time trapping along eastern rivers. It was said that he could find his way through trackless wilderness in any direction. He was killed by lightning at Harpswell 14 July, 1797, at the age of 79. (Gravestone in Great Island Cemetery.) Mary (Smalley) Boey Ridley died the following year at Harpswell 13 April, 1798 aged 77 years. She, too, is buried in the Great Island Cemetery, Harpswell.

1. George² Bowie (George¹) b. 29 July, 1747, in Truro, Mass., was only two years of age when his father died; so he probably went to Harpswell, Maine with his mother and stepfather in 1757, since he was only ten years of age at that time. On 20 December, 1775, he married in Cape Elizabeth, Rachel Strout.*

That he was a Revolutionary soldier, as Stackpole states,** is borne out by the records. In Mass. Soldiers and Sailors of the American Revolution two entries are given as follows:

(1)Bowe, George, Falmouth. Priv., Capt Tobias Lord's Co. Service from May 31, 1776, to Nov. 25, 1776, 5 mos. 25 days on seacoast at Falmouth; also Capt. John Skillin's Co., Col. Ebenezer Francis' Regiment; return for subsistence money from date of enlistment, Jan 20, to

time of arrival at Bennington, 60 days; sworn to Feb. 26, 1777.

- (2) Bowey, George, Cape Elizabeth. Priv., Capt. Samuel Thomas' Co., Col. Benjamin Tupper's Regiment. Muster return dated Jan. 26, 1778. Enlisted for town of Cape Elizabeth. Mustered by Col. Varrick; reported discharged by Dr. Pots.

An old deed, dated 22 December, 1786, shows that George Bowe, Yeoman, purchased from Daniel Small, yeoman, both of Cape Elizabeth for £53 6s. 8d several pieces of land comprising $29\frac{3}{4}$ acres of land with house and barn near Long Creek.

The exact date of George² Bowie's death is not known. Stackpole states that about the year 1793 (that is, when Bowie was about forty-six years of age) he was drowned. Family tradition says that his death occurred while he was fishing for mackerel in Portland Harbor. The date of his wife's death is also unknown. But it must have been before 5 November, 1808, for an old deed bearing that date states that "David Bowe, of Durham, yeoman, James Bowe, yeoman, Rachel Bowe, spinster, of Cape Elizabeth, conveyed to Alexander Bowe, of Cape Elizabeth, for \$54 all title to the real estate of their father, George Bowe, late of Cape Elizabeth, deceased, containing about 22 acres in said Cape Elizabeth, which had been purchased by said George Bowe of Daniel Small, by said Daniel's deed dated 22nd day of December 1786."

2. Alexander² Bowie (George¹), b. in Truro, Mass., 24 March, 1749 was only eight years old when his mother, Mary (Smalley) Ridley and her husband took him to Harpswell, Maine, to live in 1757. In the Census of 1790 for Bowdointown, Alexander "Boah" was

listed as having in his family one male and three females --- himself, his wife, and two daughters. Who his wife was is not known. Neither is there any record of their deaths.

According to Stackpole, he went to Durham, Maine, before 1800 and settled on the east end of lot 111, which he bought on 30 April, 1805, from John Robinson for \$232.* On 8 June, 1800, he married Betsy Stoddard, of Durham, who was born in Charlestown, Mass., 12 December, 1777, and died in Durham 2 April, 1861.** George Bowie died there 23 September, 1857.*** Both are buried on Bowie Hill, and since he was a private in the Durham Militia in 1812, there is a flag on his grave.

APPENDIX A

The Smalley (Smalle, Small), Hicks, and Dyer Families

Samuel Smalley, the father of Mary (Smalley) Bowie, was born in 1690 in Maine or New Hampshire, the son of Francis³ and Elizabeth (Hicks) Smalley, the grandson of Francis² and Elizabeth (Leighton?) Smalle, and the great-grandson of Edward¹ and Elizabeth Small. About 1713 Samuel Smalley married Isabel Dyer, born in July, 1695, at Barnstable, Mass., daughter of Dr. William and Mary (Taylor) Dyer. Samuel Smalley was probably a whale fisherman and was lost at sea between 1727 and 1729.

Edward¹ Small came from Bideford, Devon, England, about 1632 with his oldest son Francis² under the auspices of his kinsman, Sir Ferdinando Gorges, and founded Piscataqua, which has since been divided into Kittery, Eliot, South Berwick, and Berwick, Maine. Edward Small was a cavalier of high social position and a kinsman of the Champernowns, the most powerful family of Denonshire, and the descendants of Byzantine kings. He was also a relative of Sir John and Sir Humphrey Gilbert and Sir Walter Raleigh. One of the Champernown girls married a Gilbert and became the mother of Sir John and Sir Humphrey Gilbert. After her husband's death, she married a Raleigh and became the mother of Sir Walter Raleigh.

Francis² Small, the great-grandfather of Mary (Smalley) Bowie, was only a boy of twelve when he came from England with his father, Edward¹. He was in Dover, N.H., in 1648, but by 1657 he was in Falmouth, Maine. In the meantime, about 1652 or 1653, he married Elizabeth Leighton(?). In 1659 he established a trading camp on the island of Sebascodegan, now Great Island, in the district of Harpswell -- an island well-known for its sturgeon fishery. In 1668 he built a trading camp in what is now Cornish, Maine -- the first house in the town. When the Indians burned this house, Captain Sundry, a friendly chief, sold Small for a nominal sum the Ossipee Tract -- a tract twenty miles square. Later Small sold the land south of the Little Ossipee River and reserved what is now Limington, Limerick, Newfield, Parsonsfield, and Cornish. It was in his honor that Cornish was first named Francisborough in 1772. He led a roving life as fisherman, trapper, and Indian trader. Sullivan in his History of Maine refers to him as the 'great land-owner', and there is no doubt that he owned the largest number of acres of any person who ever lived in Maine.

Francis³, the grandfather of Mary (Smalley) Bowie, was born about 1659 in Maine. He married Elizabeth Hicks, daughter of Samuel and Lydia (Doane) Hicks. Francis Small was a carpenter in the mastyard at Dover, N.H. In 1702 he went to Truro, Mass., where he died between 22 August, 1709 and 5 April, 1710.

Samuel Hicks, the father of Elizabeth (Hicks) Small, was the son of of Robert and Margaret (Winslow) Hicks. Robert Hicks came from Southwark, England, to Plymouth in the Fortune 11 November, 1621. He was descended from Sir Ellis Hicks, who was knighted by Edward

the Black Prince in 1356. He was a man of education and active in the affairs of the colony until his death 24 March, 1647. Margaret (Winslow) Hicks and her four children followed her husband to America in the Anne in 1623. Her son Samuel married Lydia, daughter of John Doane of Eastham. Robert Hicks died at Plymouth, Mass., 24 March, 1647.

Mary Bowie's mother, Isabel (Dyer) Smalley, was born in 1695 at Barnstable, Mass., the daughter of Dr. William Dyer (1653-1738) and Mary (Taylor) Dyer (1658-1738). Dr. Dyer was a highly respected physician in those early days. Mary Dyer was the daughter of Henry and Lydia (Hatch) Taylor, the latter being the daughter of Thomas and Grace Hatch. The father of Dr. Dyer was William, who came over to Boston in 1627 with his brother George, his sister Tabitha, and George's daughter, Mary Dyer. Dr. Dyer's oldest brother, Samuel Dyer, married Anne Hutchinson, granddaughter of the famous Anne.

APPENDIX B

The Ridley and Strout Families

James Ridley, born in Truro, Mass., 6 February, 1718, was the son of Thomas and Mary (Strout) Ridley, who married in Truro, Mass., 3 August 1708. James Ridley married (1) 30 March, 1738, Ruth Smalley, born 6 January, 1718, daughter of Daniel⁴ and Sarah Smalley, of Truro, Mass. Daniel⁴ Smalley was the son of Francis³ and Elizabeth (Hicks) Smalley and a brother to Samuel⁴, who was the father of Mary (Smalley) Bowie (spelled 'Boey', 'Bowoe', and even 'Bowacy').

James and Ruth Ridley had six children, born in Truro, Mass.,-- Ann, 1740; Sarah, 1743; James, Jr., 1745; Ambrose, 1747/8; David, 1750; and Ruth, 1752. Ruth (Smalley) Ridley must have died sometime between 28 March, 1752, when her daughter Ruth was born, and 17 September, 1753, when her husband married a second wife. James Ridley married (2) 17 September, 1753, Mary (Smalley) Bowie, who was a first cousin to his first wife, Ruth Smalley. James and Mary Ridley had two children, born in Truro, Mass. -- Mary, born 23 April, 1754; and David, born 21 August, 1755.

About 1756 or 1757 James Ridley and his family went to Great Sebascodegan Island (now called Great Island) in the district of Harpswell, Maine, and settled at what is now called Ridley Point. Francis² Smalley, the great-grandfather of Mary (Smalley) Ridley, had established a trading camp on this island in 1659 and had purchased it for Major Shapleigh. Even at this early date it was famous for its sturgeon fishery. The fish were cut up, cured and shipped to Spanish markets. James and Mary Ridley did not sail to this wilderness in Casco Bay all alone. Among others were her brother, Taylor Smalley, who had

married her husband's sister, Thankful Ridley, and their children.

Here James Ridley owned extensive lands and carried on hunting, fishing, and farming. In 1775 he saw service in the Revolution. He was killed by lightning 14 July, 1797, aged 79. Mary Ridley, his wife, died 13 April, 1798, aged 77.

APPENDIX K

The Bowies and Their Name

The name of Bowie is believed by some authorities to have been of ancient Norse origin. About 860 A.D. a number of jarls and their families fled from Norway to escape the tyranny of Harold the Fair-Haired, and settled in Iceland and in the Hebrides of Scotland. In Leighton's Olaf the Glorious Bue the Thick was a celebrated Viking who fell in the Battle of Joms-vikings. This same Bue the Thick, or Bui the Big, is referred to in old histories as a famous warrior who was a powerful personage at the Norwegian Court during the reign of Hardy Canute. Others say that the name Bowie is a phonetic spelling of the Gaelic Buidhe, which pronounced Booay, or Booaie, means 'victory', 'conquest', or 'success', and also 'yellow-haired', or 'with saffron-colored garments', which, among the ancient Gaels or Picts, was symbolic of royal extraction.

As early as 605 A.D. the name was borne by Eocha Bui, known in English as Eugene IV, King of Scotland (605-621). Like his father, Aidan, Bui was a great warrior and kept the Saxons in constant alarm. He also repaired all the churches in his realm.

In the year 1200 A.D. the ancient cathedral of Stirling was built, and on either side of the structure, forming as it were the double arms of a cross, were two chapels. One was the Queen's Iyle, or Chapel, and the other, Bowye's Iyle. A family which in that era could have a portion of this celebrated structure named for it must have been one of much power and importance. In 1600 the name was changed to Stirling Iyle by the Earl of Stirling, who was undoubtedly of Bowie extraction.

In Stirlingshire for several centuries the Bowies have been quite numerous and influential. Bowie Hall, near Denby, was for many generations owned by them, and only passed into other hands during the eighteenth century.

In 1553 the parish register at Stirling mentions a John Bowye, and a few years later James and William Bowye. On 1 Dec., 1581, Jereme Bowie, Master of the King's Wines, was granted a house and garden at Cowper by King James VI. In 1597 James Bowie, son of Jereme deceased, was appointed Master of the King's Wines. In the early seventeenth century mention is found of a Thomas Bowie of Whitekirk and a John Bowie of Denny near Stirling, and about the beginning of the eighteenth century further record is found of a Walter Bowie, of Glasgow, a William Bowie of Stirlingshire, and one Walter Bowie, who is said to have been the son of James. At the Battle of Waterloo a Captain John Bowie (1815) was killed, and another Bowie, also an officer fell at the Battle of Inkerman (1854).

When the name was first spelled Bowie it is difficult to say, but from Bue, Bui, Buie, Buidhe, Bowhie, Boye, Bowye, Boey, Bowey, Bowoey, and Bowe, it finally became Bowie. In fact, when George Bowie came from Scotland to Boston, Mass. in the early eighteenth century, he spelled his name Bowoey, and when his children were born in Truro, Mass., the name was recorded as Boey. Later these same children were called Boweys, and their children wrote the name Bowe. Even as late as 1867, when my mother was born in Cape Elizabeth, Maine, her birth was recorded under the name Florence Lillian Bowe, although she has told me that her family always spelled the name Bowie. One closely related branch of the family here in Maine still (in 1962) spells the name Bowe.

W.W.Bowie in his The Bowies and Their Kindred has written; 'The history of this family, whether amid the rugged hills of Scotland or on the more fertile shores of America, shows that with the fighting blood of their ancestors, the freebooting vikings, they inherited the love of freedom and fearless spirit characteristic of the Scotch Highlander and his descendants on both sides of the Atlantic.'

APPENDIX L

General Occupational Trends of the Descendants of George¹ Bowie

Many of the Bowies have shown a deep religious fervor. Among the ministers have been The Rev. Robert S. Bowie (1818-1901) of Lisbon; the Rev. Greenfield Bowie (1840-1921), of Hartland; and the Rev. Robert L. Rand (1935-), son of Alfreda (Bowie) Rand, of Lewiston. There have also been several preachers -- for instance, Joseph Henry Bowie, Northboro, Mass., and Ruth Hope Bowie, Ease Weare, N.H.

The teachers also have been many. An unusual family of teachers is the four daughters of Leon and Almeda (Libby) Bowie -- Alice Bowie Taylor, a teacher at Waynflete, Portland; Louise (Bowie) Sylvester, a teacher in Auburn; Margaret (Bowie) Rendall, a teacher in South Portland; and Dorothy Bowie, a teacher in Arlington, Mass. Their mother, Almeda Bowie, was also a teacher.

Another family of four teachers is the family of Lillian (Bowie) Chaplin -- Leola Bowie (Chaplin) Ellis, who has retired after 31 years of teaching at Deering High and Westbrook Junoir College, Portland, and University of Maine, Orono; Joseph B. Chaplin, who after 38 years of teaching, the last 22 years as principal of Bangor High, is now Associate Director of Admissions at the University of Maine; Kera (Chaplin) Millard, who has retired after 32 years of teaching -- 21 of those years at Cornish High; and Stuart C. Chaplin, who after 25 years of teaching, the last ten years as Headmaster at Berwick Academy, is now programmer for an electronic computer at the Portsmouth (N.H.) Navy Yard.

Other teachers have been Angela Florence Bowie (1872-1939), who taught in New Bedford, Mass. for over 40 years; Harold E. Bowie, who has been Head of the Mathematics Department at the American International College, Springfield, Mass. for many years; and Myron Wayne Bowie, who is a teacher at Kittery.

There have also been representatives of the medical profession. Dr. Willis A. Bowie (1862-1891) was a graduate of Dartmouth College in two and one-half years, and later practiced medicine in Vermont and North Conway, N.H. Another physician who died as a young man was Dr. George W.R. Bowie (1910-1940), a graduate of Bowdoin College in 1930 and Jefferson Medical College in 1934, Philadelphia, Pa., who practiced medicine in Vanceboro.

Musicians too have not been lacking. An outstanding group was the family of Charles Henry and Alice (Canham) Bowie, of Lisbon, who had a family orchestra. Charles Bowie, who played the French horn in the Payne Second Regiment Band, played the cello in the family orchestra; Mrs. Bowie played the piano; Elsie, the violin; Celia, the cornet; Anton, the clarinet; and Hubert, the trombone.

A well-known artist was Frank Louville Bowie (1856-1936), who studied under Fox and Hudson, and at the Cox Art School, Boston, Mass., and painted for 45 years in Portland.

Like this artist, many of the Bowies have been skillful with their hands. Edwin R. Bowie was an especially skillful cabinet and pattern maker in New Bedford, Mass. Ivory Bowie was a maker of fine violins with some talent as a violinist. Harrison E. Bowie of Bath was ingenious at wood-carving and making clocks and boats. Fred R. Bowie was a fine penman and maker of pen and ink sketches. Albert G. Bowie was an architect in the firm of Proctor and Bowie, Waterville. James P. Bowie was a landscape gardener in South Portland; Norris C. Bowie is a florist-designer in Farmingdale; and Douglas B. Bowie is a florist in Lisbon. Nellie V. Bowie was a draper for Grimm and Anderson, Dress-makers, Boylston Street, Boston, Mass. Rebecca and Grace Bowie were milliners in Portland, and Amelia Bowie was a milliner in Boston, Mass.

The Bowies have also been proficient in the culinary arts. David Bowie (1787-1860) owned the first public bakery in Durham. Alexander Bowie (1811-1887) had a restaurant in Portland. Charles F. Bowie (1861-1941) was a chef for many years at Phillips-Exeter Academy, Exeter, N.H. William E. Bowie (1876- ?) was a chef in Boston, Mass. Many of the Bowie women have been notable cooks.

Railroading has appealed to many of the Bowies. For example, George Bowie of Gardiner and Wesley Bowie of Oxford both worked on the railroad. Myron Bowie of Baldwin was a brakeman on the Maine Central Railroad and Walter Bowie of Hiram was a section foreman there. Major F. Bowie of Falmouth was an overseer. John Bowie of Bath was a conductor and Augustus Bowie of Saco for thirty years was an engineer on the Portland, Saco, and Portsmouth, the Eastern, and the Boston and Maine Railroads.

From their Viking ancestors, many of the Bowies seem to have inherited a love of the sea. The early generations were mostly fishermen and seafarers. George Bowie, son of the pioneer George, met his death while fishing for mackerel in Casco Bay. His son, James, was shipwrecked near Halifax, N.S. during the War of 1812, was imprisoned there, but finally escaped and settled in Tracadie, Antigonish County, N.S. Another James Bowie, a nephew of this James, was a sea captain, visiting many foreign ports.

The best-known Bowie, however, was Samuel Ridlon Bowie (1833-1882) a glassmaker in New Bedford, Mass. He invented a process of decorating glass with paint and covering it with glaze. Many books on old glass mention him.
